

## Vehicle Identification Number Self-Certification

**Texas Residents with vehicles located outside the state of Texas may complete this self certification when applying for a negotiable Texas Certificate of Title in lieu of an Out-of-state Identification Certificate (DPS form VI-30).**

**Submit additional documentation as indicated below, if required.**

**Select applicable box:**

- ☐ **Recreational Vehicle owner with vehicle temporarily out-of-state**
- ♦ Attach valid proof of Texas residency. Acceptable documents include a property tax receipt, utility statement, etc.

- ☐ **Apportioned Vehicle Out-of-State**
- ♦ Indicate current apportioned account number:  
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- ☐ **Military Personnel located Out-of-State**
- ♦ Attach a copy of current military orders or signed statement from the Provost Marshall.

- ☐ **Student located Out-of-State**
- ♦ Attach verification of current student status. Acceptable documents include a tuition receipt, enrollment form, student identification card, etc.

- ☐ **Official serving in the U.S. Congress**
- ♦ No additional documentation is required.

- ☐ **Title Only Applicant**
- ♦ Attach Form VTR-131, *Application for Title Only* and valid proof of Texas residency, such as a property tax receipt, utility statement, etc.
